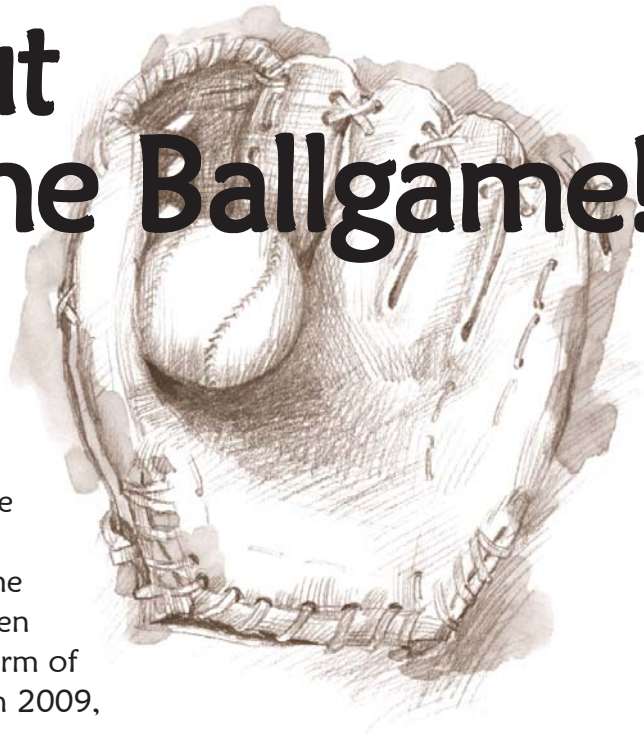


# Take Me Out to the Ballgame!

A warm evening at Victory Field is a peak summer experience in Indianapolis. In 2001, *Sports Illustrated* named the home of the Indianapolis Indians the Best Minor-League Ball Park in America. As the sky darkens and the skyline sparkles over the diamond, you'll understand the appeal of a park designed by the same architects who created Baltimore's Camden Yards and Cleveland's Jacobs Field. But the charm of the place won't distract you from the game. In 2009, the Indians were involved in the most one-run contests in all of Triple-A Baseball with 51 one-run games. The Tribe also played in the most contests decided by two runs or less in all of Minor League baseball with 84. Win or lose, we won't be bored!

On June 10, the Indians–Triple-A affiliate of the Pirates and second oldest minor league franchise in American sports–will be wrapping up a home stand against the Pawtucket Red Sox, Triple-A affiliate of the Boston Red Sox. PPP council leaders will be in attendance for an evening of classic stadium cuisine, good company and great baseball. We will depart the Westin at 5:30 pm for a short walk to Victory Field.
